The Pleasant Run Trail, which can be reached very close to where the Cultural Trail ends in Fountain Square, travels through the rolling hills of tree covered Garfield Park. At 128 acres, Garfield Park is the oldest park in the city of Indianapolis.

Designed in 1881 by the same world famous city planner, George Kessler, who influenced Mr. Greenway, **Ray Irvin**, it follows the lines of two creeks. Its features include the first conservatory building in America, an amphitheater, sunken gardens, fountains, picnic areas, two arts centers, tennis courts, ball fields, horseshoe pits and a huge pool complex, etc.
